
HEAD A Father Baker Legacy

#LVCharities A Father Baker Legacy

OLV Charities (OLVC) empowers its mission partners—among them OLV Human Services, OLV National Shrine & Basilica, and Camp Turner—to grow and thrive by engaging a growing network of relationships, securing financial resources, and providing essential support services.



In April, OLVC acquired Camp Turner, allowing the 98-year-old, faith-based summer camp located in Alleghany State Park to open after a one-year hiatus. More than 360 young people attended in 2021. Support of OLVC's digital media program resulted in regularly live-streamed Masses from the Basilica, an EWTN documentary, local programming, and social media videos, extending Father Baker's reach throughout the world. As the pandemic lessened its grip in mid-2021, volunteerism became popular again. Among the ways folks got involved: Camp Turner projects, tending Basilica gardens, event-planning committees, and a new "National Ambassador" program for friends outside of WNY.



Attracting thousands of visitors from across the globe each year, OLV National Shrine & Basilica stands as a symbol of Venerable Nelson Baker's devotion to his patroness, Mary. In August of 2021, the Basilica kicked off its five-year Centennial Celebration, marking 100 years since construction began.

OLV Human Services A Father Baker Legacy

OLV Human Services (OLVHS) touched the lives of nearly 4,000 children, teens, adults, and families last year. One of the largest non-profit agencies in the region, OLVHS is dedicated to fostering the highest possible quality of life for those in its care through a diverse array of social, health and human services.

In September, the ribbon was cut on a new handicap-accessible entranceway to the 790 Ridge Road building. Included within is the *Statler Foundation WAY Café*, a wonderful place for visitors to stop for a cup of coffee and a bite to eat that is staffed by young people with behavioral and mental challenges. Donor support was critical to allowing OLVHS' emergency foster care

program to remain open during the

pandemic. This important initiative-

one of only a few of its kind in New

York State—provides lodging and care

for children who have been abruptly

removed from their homes due to

neglect and/or abuse.

Nearly 100 students on our residential campus received specialized mental and behavioral care, as well as educational services, giving them the skills and tools to return to their homes or live independently.

In October, skilled craftsmen worked to restore and improve the Basilica's organ which was in need of attention after decades of deterioration. To celebrate, a special recital program, featuring renowned organist Roland Martin, was held that same month.

Supported by the National Fund for Sacred Places and generous benefactors, work began on several critical restoration projects at the Basilica, including addressing water damage/drainage issues (shown above), as well as renovations on the community spaces in the Shrine's lower level. Projects will continue through 2023.
