Jason wondered...when will the next blow come?

He endured regular, horrific beatings from his birth mother when her anger got the best of her. Because she was so absorbed in herself, his basic needs were neglected.

Is it any surprise that Jason was constantly hurting, feeling scared, and lonely?

As Jason tried to cope with his own pain, emotional and behavioral disorders started. He became so desperate that he frequently thought of taking his own life.

Because of such suicidal attempts, he was taken to the emergency psychiatric unit at a local hospital. Upon discharge, it was determined that he could not return to his birth mother. So, he was placed with a foster family. But because of the trauma that haunted him, his foster parents realized that they could not handle him. As a result, Jason was moved from one foster family to another. Then for safety reasons, he was transferred to OLV Human Services for help.

While in our residential program, Jason received the love and care needed to address his dreadful past. The progress was slow. But through intensive counseling, Jason eventually learned how to set limits, control his behavior and develop relational skills. Slowly, his attitude also changed.

Jason's recent foster parents visit him regularly. Seeing how he's turning his life around, they're now ready to adopt him. He's so excited to be reunited with them. And now he knows he is loved!

March 2019 – Msgr. Burkard's Farewell Tour of Florida takes place and his loyal friends and benefactors fully fund his last **Coming Home Project** to improve housing for children in his care

May 2019 – OLV Human Services appoints Cindy Lee as CEO

June 2019 - Documentary Heritage and Preservation Services of NY visits OLV to conduct an Archival Needs Assessment focusing on over 30,000 adoption records dating back to the early 1900's



August 2019 – The Strategic Plan for OLV Charities is approved by the Board of Directors – this plan is the roadmap for the organization's efforts during the next five years

October 2019 – Nearly 2,000 donors sent intentions written on pieces of fabric, which were stitched together to make an altar cloth used during our annual celebration of the Feast of Our Lady of Victory

November 2019 - Groundbreaking of OLV Human Services Phase I of the 790 Ridge Road Accessibility Improvement Project; this includes construction of a new entrance, reception area and coffee café, providing greater access for over 8,000 clients, staff and visitors

May 2019 – Baker Victory Nite raises more than \$168K from a sellout crowd to support children in foster care



July 2019 - 600 faithful attend the 83rd Annual Father Baker Day Mass. The Sisters of St. Joseph honored Father Baker by placing a wreath at his final resting place within the Basilica



October 2019 – The Home Depot Foundation provided a grant and 60 Home Depot volunteers descended on our residential campus to make improvements to an emergency foster care cottage

Introducing the New OLV Brands

As a man, Father Baker was historic. As a leader, teacher, and visionary, he was – and continues to be – a heroic example.

In 2019, OLV honored him and his unwavering devotion to his Patroness – Mary, Our Lady of Victory – by proudly introducing a new shared visual identity.



The development of our marketing plan began earlier this year when we assembled a collection of groups to examine how we were viewed in the community.

We gathered information to begin the creative process for renaming and reimagining our logos and tagline.

The beauty of this new identity – beyond unifying the organizations from naming and visual perspectives – is the subtle intricacies that have been incorporated into our logos.

Father Baker was often quoted as saying, “She (Mary, Our Lady of Victory) did it all!” Therefore, OLV is represented first in the arrangement of the logo. We then follow OLV with the new names of each of the organizations.
